Catechism Corner by Kacey Carey, DRE

Many of us at times have felt like the Lord is just not listening . But like the woman in the gospel , when we persist in seeking God's favor, we are eventually rewarded. She went to extraordinary means to "persuade" Jesus to help her. She demeaned herself , not caring what others thought , to beg Jesus to cure her daughter. But Jesus was testing her faith, by initially rebuking her. " I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel." With her persistence and steadfastness, she eventually prevailed. We all have our consistent prayer needs which we continue to beseech Our Lord to resolve. And often , even for a lifetime, the intercessory prayers seem to go unanswered. But the very definition of hope in Christ , is that our prayers will eventually be granted according to God's plan. Like Dietrich Bonhoffer said "anyone who knows Easter, can not despair." The Lord is not deaf to our petitions. He wants us to be persistent and steadfast for the long haul. Our crosses are custom made personally for us so that we can have a prayer focus, trusting in the Lord for intervention. We have but to maintain our course, continue our petitions and hope in the Lord. Hope is trusting in what God has promised us , even though we do not yet see it. God's Holy Spirit is given to us so that we can patiently hope for the Truth.

Muchos de nosotros a veces hemos sentido que el Señor simplemente no está escuchando. Pero como la mujer del evangelio, cuando persistimos en buscar el favor de Dios, finalmente somos recompensados. Ella recurrió a medios extraordinarios para "persuadir" a Jesús de que la ayudara. Se rebajó a sí misma, sin importarle lo que pensarán los demás, para rogar a Jesús que curara a su hija. Pero Jesús estaba probando su fe, inicialmente reprendiéndola. "Fui enviado solamente a las ovejas perdidas de la casa de Israel". Con su persistencia y firmeza, finalmente prevaleció. Todos tenemos nuestras necesidades constantes de oración que continuamos suplicando a Nuestro Señor que resuelva. Y a menudo, incluso durante toda la vida, las oraciones de intercesión parecen quedar sin respuesta. Pero la definición misma de la esperanza en Cristo es que nuestras oraciones eventualmente serán concedidas de acuerdo al plan de Dios. Como decía Dietrich Bonhoffer "cualquiera que conozca la Pascua, no puede desesperarse". El Señor no es sordo a nuestras peticiones. Él quiere que seamos persistentes y firmes a largo plazo. Nuestras cruces están hechas personalmente para nosotros para que podamos tener un enfoque de oración, confiando en la intervención del Señor. Sólo tenemos que mantener nuestro curso, continuar nuestras peticiones y esperar en el Señor. La esperanza es confiar en lo que Dios nos ha prometido, aunque todavía no lo veamos. El Espíritu Santo de Dios nos es dado para que podamos esperar pacientemente la Verdad.
