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Catechism Corner by Kacey Carey, DRE

Many have received unsolicited survey calls from political packs, fundraising committees or research polls. But Jesus initiated the first Gallop poll by asking Peter " Who do You say that I am?" And Peter rose to the occasion with sincere truthfulness. "You are the Christ (Anointed One), the Son of the living God." Then Jesus responded with "You are Peter (Greek for large rock) and upon this rock I will build my church and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it." With characteristic style, our Lord changed Simon's name to Peter , symbolically reinforcing the large rock in which they were standing and simultaneously founding the Catholic Church . It is noteworthy that Caesarea Philippi (for the Roman god Pan) was rechristened to become a significant place in that this 'rock' has symbolic meaning in multiple ways. This is a major milestone for our faith with Christ establishing the Church and it's headship and the sacrament of Confession, in one fell swoop. Jesus gave the authority to "bind and loose" forgiveness of sins to Peter and the other apostles. Our Protestant brothers and sisters often state that they prefer to confess their sins to God rather than to a "man". Catholics however follow what Jesus established by initiating the papacy with each ordained priest acting in "persona Christi". When we confess our sins in the confessional , we are confessing directly to Jesus, not merely an ordinary man. And only a Catholic priest has the power to forgive our sins through this sacrament. So our faith flows from this pivotal moment in church history. We can all be proud to say our church was founded on solid rock.

Our Catechism says : "Unity in matters of faith and morals, which is guaranteed by the Church's Magisterium , or teaching authority, with the Pope at the head, is one reason for the remarkable resilience and influence of the Catholic Church." (880-882,936-937)

Rincón de Catecismo por Kacey Carey, DRE

Muchos han recibido llamadas de encuestas no solicitadas de grupos políticos, comités de recaudación de fondos o encuestas de investigación. Pero Jesús inició la primera encuesta del Galope preguntándole a Pedro "¿Quién dices que soy yo?" Y Peter estuvo a la altura de las circunstancias con sincera veracidad. "Tú eres el Cristo (Ungido), el Hijo del Dios vivo". Entonces Jesús respondió: "Tú eres Pedro (en griego, roca grande) y sobre esta roca edificaré mi iglesia y las puertas del infierno no prevalecerán contra ella". Con estilo característico, nuestro Señor cambió el nombre de Simón por el de Pedro, reforzando simbólicamente la gran roca en la que se encontraban y simultáneamente fundando la Iglesia Católica. Es de destacar que Cesarea de Filipo (en honor al dios romano Pan) fue rebautizada para convertirse en un lugar significativo en el sentido de que esta "roca" tiene un significado simbólico de múltiples maneras. Este es un hito importante para nuestra fe en que Cristo establece la Iglesia y su jefatura y el sacramento de la Confesión, de una sola vez. Jesús dio la autoridad para "atar y desatar" el perdón de los pecados a Pedro y a los demás apóstoles. Nuestros hermanos y hermanas protestantes afirman a menudo que prefieren confesar sus pecados a Dios antes que a un "hombre". Los católicos, sin embargo, siguen lo que Jesús estableció al iniciar el papado con cada sacerdote ordenado actuando "persona Christi". Cuando confesamos nuestros pecados en el confesionario, lo estamos confesando directamente a Jesús, no simplemente a un hombre común y corriente. Y sólo un sacerdote católico tiene el poder de perdonar nuestros pecados a través de este sacramento. Entonces nuestra fe fluye de este momento crucial en la historia de la iglesia. Todos podemos estar orgullosos de decir que nuestra iglesia fue fundada sobre roca sólida.

Nuestro Catecismo dice: "La unidad en materia de fe y moral, que está garantizada por el Magisterio de la Iglesia, o autoridad docente, con el Papa a la cabeza, es una de las razones de la notable resiliencia e influencia de la Iglesia Católica". (880-882,936-937)
