**Catechism Corner by Kacey Carey, DRE**

It is often said that the storyteller has the power to influence people. In Jesus day he kept it simple, using parables. He likened the Kingdom of God to a sower of seed, a mustard seed and yeast in three measures of flour. All three stories are relatable to the people of his day as they are to people of our day. The common thread that seems to run through them is a small amount of a substance can manifest itself into something much greater. That small substance of seeds and yeast are you and I. Given just a tiny amount of faith , we can accomplish great things with patience and steadfastness. The mustard seed is the smallest of seeds, yet can blossom into a gigantic tree. The seed sown on good soil or a receptive listening heart can blossom into a strong steadfast ability to follow God. A small amount of yeast in flour can balloon into hundreds of loaves of bread. Despite these small substances growing against seemingly large odds, they all can be undone by susceptibility to evil. This threat to success Jesus warns will always be amongst all our good endeavors. No matter our good intentions, patience and steadfastness, we can easily falter into sin. This makes the parables more compelling as our good example will starkly contrast with that of evil. In order for us to follow the Lord, we will always have to deal with people that are not on the same path. These non-believers have the power to derail our good intentions, halt our progress and even to doubt our will to continue. This testing can last a lifetime, always demanding we choose good over evil. Yet with patience , prayer and understanding, the Lord shows us that we can prevail.

**Rincón de Catecismo por Kacey Carey, DRE**

¡A menudo se dice que el narrador tiene el poder de influir en las personas. En los días de Jesús lo mantuvo simple, usando parábolas. Comparó el Reino de Dios a un sembrador de semilla, una semilla de mostaza y levadura en tres medidas de harina. Las tres historias se relacionan con la gente de su época como lo son con la gente de nuestros días. El hilo común que parece correr a través de ellos es que una pequeña cantidad de una sustancia puede manifestarse en algo mucho mayor. Esa pequeña sustancia de semillas y levadura somos tú y yo. Con solo una pequeña cantidad de fe, podemos lograr grandes cosas con paciencia y constancia. La semilla de mostaza es la más pequeña de las semillas, pero puede florecer hasta convertirse en un árbol gigantesco. La semilla sembrada en buena tierra o un corazón receptivo que escucha puede florecer en una habilidad firme y fuerte para seguir a Dios. Una pequeña cantidad de levadura en la harina puede convertirse en cientos de barras de pan. A pesar de que estas pequeñas sustancias crecen contra probabilidades aparentemente grandes, todas pueden deshacerse por la susceptibilidad al mal. Esta amenaza para el éxito, advierte Jesús, siempre estará entre todos nuestros buenos esfuerzos. No importa nuestras buenas intenciones, paciencia y firmeza, podemos caer fácilmente en el pecado. Esto hace que las parábolas sean más convincentes ya que nuestro buen ejemplo contrastará marcadamente con el del mal. Para que podamos seguir al Señor, siempre tendremos que tratar con personas que no están en el mismo camino. Estos no creyentes tienen el poder de descarrilar nuestras buenas intenciones, detener nuestro progreso e incluso dudar de nuestra voluntad de continuar. Esta prueba puede durar toda la vida, siempre exigiendo que elijamos el bien sobre el mal. Sin embargo, con paciencia, oración y comprensión, el Señor nos muestra que podemos prevalecer.
