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Catechism Corner by Kacey Carey, DRE

At first reading today's gospel diverts into 3 seemingly unrelated trails. The kingdom of heaven is like finding a pearl of great price; nets full of various fish and separating the righteous from the wicked. It is hard for us to relate to these antiquated analogies, but the first reading makes it clearer. Of all the things Solomon could have asked God for (wealth, longevity, power over enemies and health), he choose wisdom. So God gave him the requested wisdom in addition to all the other unasked for things. God gave him a heart "so wise and understanding that there has never been anyone like you up to now, and after you there will come no one to equal you." And God gives us a similar choice. If we do anything and everything to gain the kingdom of heaven, we will forsake material goods for that "pearl of great price" In other words, if we treat all the things of this world as of no importance, we will seek a righteous attitude, and hold more valuable discipleship than gold or silver. If we follow Jesus, we have to want heaven more than the wealth of this world. The acquisition of heaven is the greatest of gifts , for which we should be willing to pay any price. Most of us however draw the line at discomfort, pain, martyrdom , illness, loss of social status and disfigurement. We say we want heaven yet are unwilling to sacrifice in order to get it. But all the saints gave up some of the things we choose to hang on to, and they are now in endless joy beholding the beatific vision. Do we trust God enough to give Him our FIAT, our agreement to let go and let Him decide what should happen? I know most people could not do this. I would like to think I could let go of everything, but being human, it would be very difficult. But it shouldn't stop us from making small sacrifices daily in preparation for the eventuality of an opportunity to go all in for Jesus. The more we fast, pray, and do small sacrifices, the easier to do God's will because we are choosing the narrow gate.

¡En la primera lectura, el evangelio de hoy se desvía en 3 caminos aparentemente no relacionados. El reino de los cielos es como encontrar una perla de gran precio; redes llenas de varios peces y separando a los justos de los impíos. Es difícil para nosotros relacionarnos con estas analogías anticuadas, pero la primera lectura lo aclara. De todas las cosas que Salomón podría haber pedido a Dios (riqueza, longevidad, poder sobre los enemigos y salud), escogió la sabiduría. Entonces Dios le dio la sabiduría pedida además de todas las otras cosas que no había pedido. Dios le dio un corazón "tan sabio y entendido que nunca ha habido nadie como tú hasta ahora, y después de ti no habrá nadie que te iguale". Y Dios nos da una opción similar. Si hacemos cualquier cosa y todo para ganar el reino de los cielos, abandonaremos los bienes materiales por esa "perla de gran precio". En otras palabras, si tratamos todas las cosas de este mundo como si no tuvieran importancia, buscaremos una actitud justa. , y tienen un discipulado más valioso que el oro o la plata. Si seguimos a Jesús, tenemos que desear el cielo más que las riquezas de este mundo. La adquisición del cielo es el mayor de los regalos, por el cual deberíamos estar dispuestos a pagar cualquier precio. Sin embargo, la mayoría de nosotros ponemos límites a la incomodidad, el dolor, el martirio, la enfermedad, la pérdida de estatus social y la desfiguración. Decimos que queremos el cielo pero no estamos dispuestos a sacrificarnos para conseguirlo. Pero todos los santos renunciaron a algunas de las cosas a las que elegimos aferrarnos, y ahora están en un gozo infinito contemplando la visión beatífica. ¿Confiamos en Dios lo suficiente como para darle nuestro FIAT, nuestro acuerdo de dejarlo ir y dejar que El decida lo que debe suceder? Sé que la mayoría de la gente no podría hacer esto. Me gustaría pensar que podría soltar todo, pero siendo humano, sería muy difícil. Pero no debería impedimos hacer pequeños sacrificios diarios en preparación para la eventualidad de una oportunidad de darlo todo por Jesús. Cuanto más ayunamos, oramos y hacemos pequeños sacrificios, más fácil es hacer la voluntad de Dios porque estamos eligiendo la puerta estrecha.
