Catechism Corner by Kacey Carey, DRE

Bearing a grudge of unforgiveness towards a person is like drinking poison and hoping the other person dies. Our Catechism says the mercy we show to others and the mercy that we ourselves seek, is indivisible. If we ourselves are not merciful and do not forgive one another, God's mercy will not reach our hearts. (2838-2845,2862). Today's gospel agrees with this as Jesus said "If your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault, between you and him alone. If he listens to you, you have won over your brother." However many of us have a lifelong struggle with this concept of forgiveness. We think that to forgive means that we forget the fault or that we let the person off the hook so to speak, excusing bad behavior. The truth is that reconciling with another is not an emotion, rather it is a decision. When we make an act of the will, we decide to forgive the wrongs of another. It does not mean we will forget the harm done, or have to reestablish friendly relations with that person. It simply means we have decided to forgive from our head and eventually our hearts will follow. Forgiveness begins with asking God how to forgive. It can begin with praying for that person who may not know how much God loves them. If they did know God's great love, they would not have sinned against Him and against us. Once this merciful act of prayer begins we can have compassion towards the other, because we want to give and reciprocally receive God's love. But what if the person shuns our forgiveness and refuses to be reconciled? We forgive anyway. At judgement, we are accountable for everything we did (sins of commission) and everything we failed to do (sins of omission). Once we have forgiven someone, we are no longer accountable for bearing the sin of unforgiveness. However if the other person refuses our forgiveness, then they are accountable for their lack of mercy. Their exit interview with God will not be pretty.

Rincón de Catecismo por Kacey Carey, DRE

Guardar rencor por falta de perdón hacia una persona es como beber veneno y esperar que la otra persona muera. Nuestro Catecismo dice que la misericordia que mostramos a los demás y la misericordia que nosotros mismos buscamos es indivisible. Si nosotros mismos no somos misericordiosos y no nos perdonamos unos a otros, la misericordia de Dios no llegará a nuestro corazón. (2838-2845,2862). El evangelio de hoy está de acuerdo con esto, ya que Jesús dijo: "Si tu hermano peca contra ti, ve y repréndele, estando él y tú solos. Si te escucha, habrás conquistado a tu hermano". Sin embargo, muchos de nosotros tenemos una lucha de por vida con este concepto de perdón. Pensamos que perdonar significa olvidar la falta o dejar a la persona libre, por así decirlo, excusando el mal comportamiento. Lo cierto es que reconciliarse con otro no es una emoción, más bien es una decisión. Cuando hacemos un acto de voluntad, decidimos perdonar los errores de otro. No significa que olvidaremos el daño causado ni que tendremos que restablecer relaciones amistosas con esa persona. Simplemente significa que hemos decidido perdonar desde nuestra cabeza y eventualmente nuestro corazón lo seguirá. El perdón comienza con preguntarle a Dios cómo perdonar. Puede comenzar orando por esa persona que tal vez no sepa cuánto la ama Dios. Si conocieran el gran amor de Dios, no habrían pecado contra Él y contra nosotros. Una vez iniciado este acto misericordioso de oración podemos tener compasión hacia el otro, porque queremos dar y recibir recíprocamente el amor de Dios. Pero ¿qué pasa si la persona evita nuestro perdón y se niega a reconciliarse? Perdonamos de todos modos. En el juicio, somos responsables de todo lo que hicimos (pecados de comisión) y de todo lo que no hicimos (pecados de omisión). Una vez que hemos perdonado a alguien, ya no somos responsables de cargar con el pecado de la falta de perdón. Sin embargo, si la otra persona rechaza nuestro perdón, entonces es responsable de su falta de misericordia. Su entrevista de salida con Dios no será agradable.
