**Catechism Corner by Kacey Carey, DRE**

Our catechism frequently tells us to pick up our crosses and follow the Lord. However, many of us are reluctant to pick up our crosses. We say we want to be disciples. We claim to be good Catholics. We excuse ourselves from doing the hard work of witness and evangelization. Even Peter, the Rock on whom our Lord chose as His first vicar, could not believe great suffering was in store for Christ and his followers. The apostles can not accept Christ's impending fate because Our Lord deserved so much better. Peter thought he would be supportive by stating his unflinching loyalty. Peter was incredulous that Jesus would be killed and later be raised. "No such thing shall happen to you !" We would probably think the same way as Peter. But Jesus accepts and embraces his pending death. He knows the prize of saving the entire world would be worth His suffering. And Christ paid the price for our salvation , so the least we can do , is cooperate with His grace. The salvation of the world depended on Christ's decision. He played the long game, not succumbing to short term doubts and denials of what was necessary. Of course , we can not fully understand Our Lord's thinking especially that He would die for any of one of us. But our catechism says when confronted with suffering, it becomes more meaningful, if we unite it with the sufferings of Christ. Then human suffering becomes joined with the redeeming love of Christ and thus part of the divine plan that changes the world for the better.

**Rincón de Catecismo por Kacey Carey, DRE**

Nuestro catecismo nos dice frecuentemente que tomemos nuestras cruces y sigamos al Señor. Sin embargo, muchos de nosotros somos reacios a recoger nuestras cruces. Decimos que queremos ser discípulos. Decimos ser buenos católicos. Nos excusamos de hacer el arduo trabajo de testimonio y evangelización. Incluso Pedro, la Roca sobre la cual nuestro Señor eligió como Su primer vicario, no podía creer que a Cristo y sus seguidores les aguardaba un gran sufrimiento. Los apóstoles no pueden aceptar el destino inminente de Cristo porque Nuestro Señor merecía mucho mejor. Peter pensó que lo apoyaría manifestando su lealtad inquebrantable. Pedro estaba incrédulo de que Jesús fuera asesinado y luego resucitado. "¡No te sucederá tal cosa!" Probablemente pensaríamos de la misma manera que Peter. Pero Jesús acepta y abraza su muerte pendiente. Él sabe que el premio de salvar al mundo entero valdría la pena por Su sufrimiento. Y Cristo pagó el precio por nuestra salvación, así que lo mínimo que podemos hacer es cooperar con Su gracia. La salvación del mundo dependía de la decisión de Cristo. Jugó a largo plazo, sin sucumbir a dudas a corto plazo y negaciones de lo que era necesario. Por supuesto, no podemos entender completamente el pensamiento de Nuestro Señor, especialmente que Él moriría por cualquiera de nosotros. Pero nuestro catecismo dice que cuando nos enfrentamos al sufrimiento, este adquiere más significado si lo unimos a los sufrimientos de Cristo. Entonces el sufrimiento humano se une al amor redentor de Cristo y, por tanto, forma parte del plan divino que cambia el mundo para mejor.
